- Are they licensed and insured?

- What is their payment structure?

 - This information might also be available on their website.
- Do they belong to professional organizations or trade associations?
 - Serious business owners often have affiliations with professional associations like Utah Professional Organizers.
- Do they work under a written contract?
 - Most organizers use a contract to insure both they and their clients are in agreement on the specifics of the project.
